

Online Safeguarding : Urgent

Keeping your children safe when they are online is vital for parents, especially when they are of primary age. It has come to our attention that quite a few children are accessing inappropriate materials on various media sites including Tik Tok.

These materials are bordering on being pornographic, some are offensively racist and sexist and the language can be vile and very crude.

We believe that some of your children's accounts also have no restrictions and there is little or no security.

They are actually wide open to the world with **anyone** able to access the content.

We strongly advise you to check your child's accounts immediately and satisfy yourselves that the material (downloads/videos etc) is appropriate.

Please monitor your child's social media very closely.

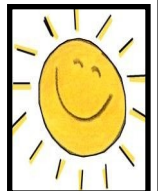
The Covid situation is continuing to improve. As a result, we now need to set a deadline for the payment of any outstanding amounts.
