Health and Safety

Although things are gradually improving as the government follows its roadmap out of lockdown, we still have to be extremely cautious. The new Indian variant is highly transmissible and is local to our area.

In school, we still have our separate playtimes for each key stage, we have lunches in the classrooms and children and staff are expected to sanitise their hands regularly.

In addition, we ask parents to be vigilant in spotting Covid symptoms early and taking prompt action by keeping their child at home and arranging for a test.

All visitors to the school are expected to wear a mask and parents are also expected to wear a mask on the school premises whilst dropping-off and picking-up.

If parents prefer not to wear a mask or are exempt, we ask for their understanding, in waiting by the gate staying away from others in the playground. Again, with the Indian variant, we have to be extra careful. Our intention is to keep visitors and parents as safe as we possibly can and to reduce the risk of the virus spreading within the school community.

Even the smallest outbreak could easily lead to children being sent home and bubbles closing. This would be more school missed and more learning lost and most children are still trying to catch up. This is not to mention



the considerable inconvenience to many parents and the serious implications on family life. Thanks again.
