
School closes for the half-term on <u>Friday 14th February.</u> School re-opens on <u>Monday 24th February</u> (Breakfast Club from 7-30am)

The school receives a small amount of money each year called <u>Pupil Premium.</u> The amount is determined by the number of children on the school roll who are entitled to free school meals (FSM), are in public care (CLA) or have parents in the armed forces.
