#### Times Tables

When children have instant recall of their times tables, it is a great help when they are carrying out calculations and problem-solving activities. In an effort to help the children develop instant recall of their "times tables" we are holding half-termly tests and awarding children badges if they gain 100% in a strictly timed test. 2,5 and 10 is Bronze badge 3,4 and 8 is Silver badge 6, 7 and 9 is Gold badge

(Lots of children were awarded a bronze this week) These badges can be worn on cardigans and ties etc. If lost, parents are able to purchase a replacement. Hopefully these badges will provide the incentive for children to revise hard, learn their tables and become better mathematicians.

### **School Owls**

As part of a whole school Geography initiative we have introduced the children to four Travelling Owls. In order to support children in learning some key Geographical locations around



the globe, we have enlisted the help of four cuddly owls to accompany us on our travels. There are two large maps (UK and World) displayed in the school hall ready for us to map any continents, countries or cities our school owls visit. #### <u>Seat Belts</u>

We have reminded the children today about the importance of wearing a seat belt when travelling in a car. #### **Administering Medicine**

Staff will willingly administer medication to a child if a form has been completed and handed in to school. (antibiotics and other medication prescribed by a doctor) As regards paracetamol-based Calpol, this

will only be administered to provide basic pain relief or reduce disconfort if a child as a temperature.
